There are too many potential problems to be able to successfully arrange and run the event. Hopefully, everything will be back to normal next year, and the Gala will be back on the calendar.

Some good news now! The club has been granted planning permission for all six projects which we have in the pipeline. For those who haven't heard, the proposals are: replacing the bay windows in the lounge; adding an extension to the bowling pavilion for extra storage; adding an accessible toilet to where the current ladies toilets are on the car park; replacing the flat roof over the main hall with a pitched roof (still under consideration by the committee); remodelling and extending the kitchen; converting a brick outbuilding to an office.

A local builder has already been approached to do some of the work and it has been agreed that he will initially do the office conversion and the kitchen remodel. If we can get the kitchen completed whilst we are closed, that will save us more disruption later. It is hoped that these two projects can be started in the second week of May.
